Sacrament = Greek word 'mysterion', Latin word 'sacramentum'

Augustine 5th cent. = an outward sign of an inward change

7 Sacraments = Baptism, Eucharist, Ordination, Confirmation

Unction, Orders and Marriage (Orthodox Chrismation)

Protestants have 2 = Holy Communion and Baptism

Protestants – Something Jesus did or commanded

Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Matt. 28:19

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John Wesley = Sacraments are a "Means of Grace"

A way in which we experience God's grace and power

In Baptism we are reminded of God's grace in Christ, Christ's transforming power

In our lives and the support of the Christian Community in our walk

In Holy Communion we are reminded of our sin, God's Love

God's grace in Christ and the ongoing power of redemption
